#### Engaging in the adult education area

In today times, generation and application of agricultural knowledge demand that people working and seeking jobs in agriculture academic and business sector pursue education beyond secondary schools. Local adult agriculture programs can address this demand through carefully prepared and evidence based curricula provision. AgriBase project objectives are therefore structured to enhance the cooperation between academia and business sectors in agriculture field and to particularly address the training needs of adult agriculture educators who are the primary target group of the project that will consequently improve the system of adult education in the field of agriculture and rural development in Europe wide communities in the East and South.

Through its milestone activities grouped under training courses, webinars, online platform and web site development, methodology and training syllabus on establishing and operating the LLL agri-units within open-university approach, the Agri Base project targeted 300 adult agriculture educators per country (3000 in total) who are the key resource for further impact and long term benefits in the cooperation between academia and business sector in the field.

The consortium approach in forming the Value Added Partnership marked a multiplier effect in terms of: access to a broader and higher quality range of professional development; stronger platform for succession planning and dissemination; better use of resources; increased innovation potential of wider European regions, and fostered potential for replication, sustainability and impact in a number of European agricultural communities in the East and South.

### AGRIBASE AT A GLANCE

AgriBase is a strategic partnership Erasmus+ project that reiterates the need for sound methods, innovative approaches and building on human resources in adult agricultural education across Southern and Eastern European communities. Over past 100 years, agricultural educators have been pioneers in the development of adult education programs, yet emphasis on adult education in agriculture itself has declined in recent years in a number of European countries, as a result the need for interdisciplinary training is reflected in a number of agricultural areas, particularly where jobs and safeguarding of material necessities for living are at stake.

Agri Base consortium sets in motion a multidisciplinary approach towards introducing the LLL in agriculture by developing new methodology and curricula in agriculture and agri-business sectors, preparing training material and organizing pilot training sessions (webinars) for adult educators in English language (farming and agriculture specific voc. and business English) and modern agri methods of production and techniques. Project strategy is based on coordinated process in this field, starting from LLL agri-units which will be sufficiently prepared to act through adequately educated agricultural experts who will have a remarkable knowledge in agriculture in terms of a change in the growing crops, cybernetic research of soil, long-term production strategies for a higher GNP, technology, language, internet, marketing and management (including financial aspects).






#### O1 Baseline report

The Baseline report refers on the current conditions and trends in adult education in agriculture in ten countries of the consortium. The baseline report moves from some general facts about each of the above mentioned country, to the particular aspect on the sector of agriculture with a detailed agricultural profile referring to the issues in this field, typical agricultural products and data about their production and export. The analyses is made on the current condition of LLL and AE in agriculture in terms of: institutional frame, legal frame, the role and place of the university in that process, possible previous researches in this field, financing the system of adult education, possible existing data of the effectiveness of the system; additionally, identification, i.e. suggested needs /fields/ theme for education for each institution. It is designed to contribute to a better understanding of the needs and potential direction for further development of adults education system in the field of agriculture at all countries from the Agri Base consortium.

O2 English for agricultural purposes

The O2 objective was to create set of multiusage (individual/group approach) e-EAP\* materials designed to meet the specified needs of the learner. 

Beneficiaries may choose among the variety of thematic units divided into two subcategories agriproduction and agribusiness.








# O4- e-platform and web-site

### O5- video guide to eplatform


AgriBase team prepared a video-guide to the e-platform which facilitates the usage of the materials. The video guide is of double effect:



- -disseminative (shares the information about the project activities, results and outcomes).


#### National webinars

AgriBase project consortium organized 16 national webinars based on the project intellectual outputs.
